Relationship and Sex Education (RSE)

What is RSE?



- RSE is the life long learning about physical, moral and emotional development.
- It is the understanding of the importance of marriage for family life, stable and loving relationships, respect, love and care.
- It is also about the teaching of sex, sexuality and sexual health.

RSE at St Charles Borromeo



- RSE forms a part of the RE, PSHE Programme (Personal, Social and Health Education) and science curriculum.
- Our key objective is the well-being of the child.
- We believe parents are the prime educators of their children.
- The school, church and family will work together; our role as a school is to support you and not to replace you.



Statutory requirements

Pupils should be taught to:

- describe the differences in the life cycles of a mammal, an amphibian, an insect and a bird
- describe the life process of reproduction in some plants and animals.

Notes and guidance (non-statutory)

 Pupils should find out about different types of reproduction, including sexual and asexual reproduction in plants, and sexual reproduction in animals.

Year 5/6 Science NC Animals, including humans



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Statutory requirements:

Pupils should be taught to:

• describe the changes as humans develop to old age.

Notes and guidance (non-statutory)

• Pupils should draw a timeline to indicate stages in the growth and development of humans. They should learn about the changes experienced in puberty.

 Pupils could work scientifically by researching the gestation periods of other animals and comparing them with humans; by finding out and recording the length and mass of a baby as it grows.

Right to Withdraw



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- Parents have the right to withdraw their children from elements of sex education that are **not** in line with the National Curriculum for Science, however we strongly recommend inclusion.
- Parents may not withdraw their children from any aspects of Relationship and Health Education.

SEND



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- We will ensure that RSE & Health Education is accessible for all pupils including those with Special Education Needs &/or Disability - SEND.
- We are aware that some pupils are more vulnerable, due to the nature of their SEND, and we will tailor content and teaching to their specific needs.

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A Journey in Love



- Journey in Love is the diocesan approved teaching resource for RSE.
- At the heart of this resource is the belief that we are made in the image and likeness of God. To be made in His likeness means to be a person in relationship with ourselves and others; it is in the context of relationship that our sexuality grows and develops.
- In order that children may grow and flourish healthily and holistically towards successful relationships, they must be at ease with themselves and deepen their self-knowledge.

A Journey in Love



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The programme teaches that:

- The journey begins at the moment of our conception and that God is at the heart of all love.
- Puberty can be an extremely confusing time for children, our message will be that even in this confusion, God is there.
- The Sacrament of marriage publicly declares the commitment of each spouse to the other, in acknowledgement that it is God-given.

The structure of A Journey in Love

- Social and emotional
 - Physical
 - Spiritual

Each area is broken down into:

- Introduction and content
 - Activities
 - Pause & Reflect
 - Prayer and Sing
