Communication and Language

Ask questions to find out more, to check understanding and what has been said. Begin to link listening to learning and understanding

Articulate ideas and thoughts in well-formed sentences. Use newly learnt vocabulary in different contexts.

Use speech to organise simple activities and provide little explanations

#### Understanding the World

Know that there are different countries and environments in our world and explore them on a map.

Describe special events; Chinese New Year. Easter.

Explore plant and animal growth; life cycle of a chick.

Discuss past and upcoming events with their family.

Compare different environments to their own.

#### Literacy

Retell a story using story language.

Learn rhymes, poems and songs.

Demonstrate understanding about what has been read and make a simple prediction about what might happen in a story.

Engage in non-fiction books. Use phonic knowledge to read regular words. Read all Phase 2 words and some of Phase 3 words. Write labels, short captions and attempt to write a simple sentence.

# Reception Spring Term 2024

### Topics: Space I Wonder Who Can Help

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#### Physical Development

Move freely in a range of ways with increasing balance and control including through taught Gymnastics and Dance activities.
Develop throwing and catching skills.

Form recognisable letters.

Establish the use of a tripod grip.

Handle tools, objects and construction and malleable materials with increasing control.

#### Expressive Art and Design

Sing songs from memory.

Match movements to music; create own music. Explore colour change and make patterns using different colours.

Use a range of materials to construct large and small scale structures and designs.

Begin exploring how we can change a song/rhyme (for example words, tempo, volume) to create a desired effect.

#### Mathematics

Estimate 'how many'.

Order and compare items by height, weight. Confidently subitise (to 5) rather than count small groups of objects.

Sequence familiar events and use familiar language related to time and money.

Express one more, one fewer/less.

Compose numbers up to 4-5. Compare numbers to 10. Find parts and the whole of numbers to 10. Recite numbers to 20 and back from 20, count on from a given number to 20.

Explore sharing into equal groups using practical contexts.

# Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Sort healthy food from less nutritional foods, discuss the importance of brushing our teeth. Identify and moderate their own feelings socially and emotionally.

Begin to discuss consequences of our behaviour, show some empathy and understanding of the perspective of others
