The parish have a defibrillator in the narthex of the church.


An Inspirational Visitor to St Charles

We had the privilege of welcoming Liam Flanagan to St Charles last month. I have completed two walking Marathons with Liam for the Beelieve Foundation and he is an inspirational young man. Despite the numerous obstacles Liam faces, he continues to challenge himself. Liam visited St Charles along with his Uncle, Headteacher Mr Tindall. Liam was born 3 months premature (pictured are



Liam's trousers which were too big for him) and with numerous complications such as being deaf as well as other life changing conditions. Liam shared his story highlighting how running has helped his mental health and well being. We presented Liam with some special good luck gifts and messages. He was chosen as one of 40 representatives to run for the London Marathon charitable trust, recognising his years of supporting charities through his running. Liam was on course for a 3 hour run but suffered a lacerated foot at 24.5 miles. St John's ambulance patched him up and he bravely completed the final mile. I know the children and staff have been inspired by this amazing young man and the courage he displayed on the day, it summed Liam up perfectly!

COVID in school

As we start the new term we will continue to follow updated Covid-19 guidance for schools. This will involve ensuring classrooms are ventilated and hand sanitising solution is available. During break times the children will have more space but will still play with their own equipment/games and on certain days. The children will continue to eat at the dining table as a class and will be served by the staff.



PE Kits

Our children are looking really smart in their PE kits. With the colder days approaching, can I remind parents and children (with the exception of reception class), that the sports socks should also be worn with the kit as this will help with the colder weather. Our official tracksuit can be worn but no other tops other than the school PE kit will be allowed. Any parent experiencing financial difficulty with the purchase of kit should make contact with Mr Holt in confidence and we will see if we can help you.

Returning of school library books from home

Please can we ask that any school library books that you may still have at home be returned. Unfortunately it is impossible to see how many books have/haven't been returned from the various lockdowns over the past 18 months, but we want to 'reset' the Librarian system to ensure all of the children can start checking books in/out again. Can we help?

Throughout the pandemic, we have done our very best to support families in need. I am mindful that we have come to the end of the furlough scheme and also that additional Universal credit payments are also changing. Home School Link Worker

A reminder that Weybridge schools have appointed a home school link worker, Debbie Watts. Bikes and Scooters

Bicycles and scooters should not be used in the playground. Bicycles and scooters are left at your own risk and can be left in the racks inside the Nursery and Carlo room green fencing or if space, in the racks by the office. Please do not use the racks opposite the church by the parish hall walkway as these are reserved for parishioners. Dogs, other than guide or 'assistance' dogs should not be on the school premises.

Jewellery and hair

Our usual reminder that we recommend that if children are to have their ears pierced, that this is done at the beginning of the summer holidays. No jewellery should be worn other than earrings which should be a single stud in each ear and must not be of the hooped variety. Hair for boys and girls, if below collar level, should be tied back.

Trim Trail and playground banked area before and after school A reminder that for the safety of all concerned, especially toddlers, the trim trail and banked area should not be used before or after school.

Please can you ensure we have the most up to date mobile and work numbers for at least 2 emergency contacts on our records. This is a safeguarding requirement.

Important Safeguarding Information for Parents

Along with most, if not all schools, St Charles has taken the opportunity to join the Operation Encompass scheme which will run jointly between local schools, Surrey Police and Surrey County Council.

Operation Encompass has been designed to provide early reporting on any domestic incidents that occur outside of school and might have an impact on a child in school.

Operation Encompass will ensure that a member of the school teaching staff, named a 'Key Adult' or "Deputy Key Adult", is informed the next morning that there has been a domestic incident or if a child has been reported as missing. These school colleagues will be those who already have safeguarding responsibilities and are fully aware of the sensitive and confidential issues regarding such information.

Through sharing this information with the Key Adult or Deputy Key Adult, the school can ensure that the child is supported in the most appropriate way during the school day.

Important information regarding informing the school of certain illnesses

Last term we sent out a letter informing you that one of our pupils, Freddie, is currently receiving medical treatment for leukaemia and this puts him at serious risk if exposed to infectious diseases; specifically, measles, chicken pox or shingles. Therefore, this a reminder to please let us know immediately if you suspect that your child or someone else in your household has measles, chicken pox or shingles and also follow the current guidelines for Coronavirus notification. If your child has not already been vaccinated, you should also consider vaccinating your child against measles as this is the best way to protect all children from this disease. Please discuss measles vaccination with your GP if appropriate. We have also been informed that, in order to help Freddie build up his immune system, we should not shield him from everyday coughs, colds etc. so please continue to send your children into school if they are well enough to attend. Your own child is not at risk from this situation, however as Freddie is vulnerable and his health and wellbeing is at serious risk, we depend on the cooperation of our families in this matter and Freddie's family appreciate this too.

Queen's Platinum Jubilee

The government have announced an additional bank holiday to mark the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. As this falls within the June half term holiday, Surrey schools have been awarded an **additional day of holiday on Friday 22nd October 2021**. All schools in the Xavier Catholic Education Trust, including St Charles will be closed on this day.

Isolation rules changed significantly over the summer and Test and Trace duties are now being carried out by the NHS and not by the school. The following guidance is in place for those that are deemed to be close contacts and highlights that you do not need to self-isolate if:

You're fully vaccinated – this means 14 days have passed since your final dose of a COVID-19 vaccine given by the NHS You're under 18 years and 6 months old

You're taking part or have taken part in a COVID-19 vaccine trial

You're not able to get vaccinated for medical reasons

If the above applies, you should still get a PCR test but you do not have to isolate whilst waiting for the results unless you have symptoms.

In practice this means—If your child displays COVID symptoms - please seek a PCR test as soon as possible, keeping them home until the results are known. If the test comes back positive, they will be expected to isolate for 10 days from the day symptoms started and work will be provided by school. If the result is negative, they return to school as soon as possible.

If your child is identified as a close contact through NHS Test and Trace please book a PCR test as soon as possible. Please note, if your child has no symptoms they should continue to attend school until they receive their test results. If the result returns positive they will need to isolate for 10 days from the date of the result.

If a member of your household tests positive, please book a PCR test for your child as soon as possible. Please note, if your child has no symptoms they should continue to attend school until they receive their test results. If the result returns positive they will need to isolate for 10 days from the date of the result.
