Poppy Appeal

School Attendance

This is a reminder that If you take your child(ren) out of school without authority, you may be liable to receive a penalty notice. Currently the amount payable under a penalty notice is £60.00 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days. Thereafter the amount increases to £120.00 if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that penalty notices are issued per parent/carer per child so a family of two parents and two children will receive 4 penalty notices.

Important Safeguarding Information for Parents

Reception—Wednesday

Along with most, if not all schools, St Charles has taken the opportunity to join the Operation Encompass scheme which will run jointly between local schools, Surrey Police and Surrey County Council.

Operation Encompass has been designed to provide early reporting on any domestic incidents that occur outside of school and might have an impact on a child in school.

Operation Encompass will ensure that a member of the school teaching staff, named a 'Key Adult' or "Deputy Key Adult", is informed the next morning that there has been a domestic incident or if a child has been reported as missing. These school colleagues will be those who already have safeguarding responsibilities and are fully aware of the sensitive and confidential issues regarding such information.

Through sharing this information with the Key Adult or Deputy Key Adult, the school can ensure that the child is supported in the most appropriate way during the school day.

Isolation rules changed significantly over the summer and Test and Trace duties are now being carried out by the NHS and not by the school. The following guidance is in place for those that are deemed to be close contacts and highlights that you do not need to self-isolate if:

You're fully vaccinated – this means 14 days have passed since your final dose of a COVID-19 vaccine given by the NHS

You're under 18 years and 6 months old

You're taking part or have taken part in a COVID-19 vaccine trial

You're not able to get vaccinated for medical reasons

If the above applies, you should still get a PCR test but you do not have to isolate whilst waiting for the results unless you have symptoms.

In practice this means—If your child displays COVID symptoms - please seek a PCR test as soon as possible, keeping them home until the results are known. If the test comes back positive, they will be expected to isolate for 10 days from the day symptoms started and work will be provided by school. If the result is negative, they return to school as soon as possible.

If your child is identified as a close contact through NHS Test and Trace please book a PCR test as soon as possible. Please note, if your child has no symptoms they should continue to attend school until they receive their test results. If the result returns positive they will need to isolate for 10 days from the date of the result.

If a member of your household tests positive, please book a PCR test for your child as soon as possible. Please note, if your child has no symptoms they should continue to attend school until they receive their test results. If the result returns positive they will need to isolate for 10 days from the date of the result.

Reading Help Suggestions

Research shows that getting children reading at home can increase their ability to read at school – and improve their well-being overall. Parents and carers like you can make a big difference.

Benefits of Reading:

Reading can give children a break from technology-centered activities. It can help them to relax and unwind; simply, reading a book can make children laugh and feel happier! Through hearing stories, children are also exposed to a rich and wide vocabulary. It is important to establish a regular reading routine, e.g. just before bedtime is a great time, as a nightly reading routine is associated with improved sleep in children.

Top Tips:

Read with and not to your child. It doesn't matter how long you set aside to read – just 10 minutes of quality reading time can make a big difference.

Here are a few concrete reading tips:

 \cdot Ask children lots of questions while reading.

 \cdot Use encouragement and praise to keep children engaged. Saying things like "what fantastic ideas" or "you thought so carefully about that, what might happen now?' will keep their minds working.

 \cdot Use their past experiences to talk about what's being read. Things like "have you learnt about...at school?" or "do you remember when we watched...and found out about..." are good conversation starters.

 \cdot Tune-in and listen to children, and be curious about their interests. "I didn't know you knew so much about..." or "I love reading stories about...with you," are good phrases to keep in mind.

· Look up read-aloud YouTube videos featuring authors, teachers or librarians reading their favourite stories. This way, children can watch and listen as many times as they like.

Before reading

Parents can take turns with their children to predict what the story is about – or what will happen next. Here is an activity you could try:

"Start with the cover of the book and the blurb on the back cover. Reveal the cover slowly to ask the child what they can see. Ask them to guess what is on the cover. Once they have seen the cover, ask them questions about the images on the cover – who, what, why, where and how?"

While reading

Focus on your children's reading comprehension by using strategies like prediction, questioning, clarifying, and summarising. E.G:

· Check ideas and understanding as the child is reading: 'So, you think that...' 'Did you expect...to happen?' 'Why do you think that happened?'

 \cdot Use the pictures in the book to help with comprehension.

 \cdot Describe what is happening and talk about the characters.

After reading

Don't forget: you can continue to explore the book's topic once reading time is done!

· Organise a puppet show for family members and siblings after making puppets of the characters in the book.

· Have children draw a picture of their favourite character or from their favourite page in the story.

 \cdot Encouraging children to express their opinion on the book.
