We have implemented our contingency plans resulting in very little contact between year groups and we have sadly had to cancel a number of events too. It will mean another disrupted Advent period for the children, coupled with the difficult decision to cancel public events. I know that this is yet another disappointment for the children, for us as staff and for you as parents, but it is the right decision in light of the situation the school finds itself in. #### **School Attendance**

This is a reminder that If you take your child(ren) out of school without authority, you may be liable to receive a penalty notice. Currently the amount payable under a penalty notice is £60.00 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days. Thereafter the amount increases to £120.00 if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that penalty notices are issued per parent/carer per child so a family of two parents and two children will receive 4 penalty notices. Please note that this does not apply to funerals, medical appointments etc.

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Isolation rules changed significantly over the summer and Test and Trace duties are now being carried out by the NHS and not by the school. The following guidance is in place for those that are deemed to be close contacts and highlights that you do not need to selfisolate if:

You're fully vaccinated – this means 14 days have passed since your final dose of a COVID-19 vaccine given by the NHS You're under 18 years and 6 months old

You're taking part or have taken part in a COVID-19 vaccine trial

You're not able to get vaccinated for medical reasons

If the above applies, you should still get a PCR test but you do not have to isolate whilst waiting for the results unless you have symptoms.

In practice this means—If your child displays COVID symptoms - please seek a PCR test as soon as possible, keeping them home until the results are known. If the test comes back positive, they will be expected to isolate for 10 days from the day symptoms started and work will be provided by school. If the result is negative, they should return to school as soon as possible.

If your child is identified as a close contact through NHS Test and Trace please book a PCR test as soon as possible. Please note, if your child has no symptoms they should continue to attend school until they receive their test results. If the result returns positive they will need to isolate for 10 days from the date of the result.

If a member of your household tests positive, please book a PCR test for your child as soon as possible. Please note, if your child has no symptoms they should continue to attend school until they receive their test results. If the result returns positive they will need to isolate for 10 days from the date of the result.



According to the NSPCC, 1 in 10 children in the UK have experienced neglect.

The <u>Surrey Safeguarding Children Partnership</u>\* and the NSPCC are working in partnership with the whole Surrey community to raise awareness of the signs and symptoms of child neglect.

\*The Surrey Safeguarding Children Partnership is made up of three statutory Safeguarding Partners in Surrey; Surrey County Council, Surrey Police, and Surrey Heartlands Clinical Commissioning Group - who form the Executive Group for the Partnership.



# The signs of neglect

The signs of neglect are often hard to spot, as neglect can appear in many different ways. There are six types of neglect which are described as:

# Medical neglect

A child's health needs are not met, or the child is not provided with appropriate medical treatment when needed as a result of illness or accident.

# Nutritional neglect

A child is given insufficient calories to meet their physical / developmental needs; this is sometimes associated with 'failure to thrive', though failure to thrive can occur for reasons other than neglect. A child may be given food of insufficient nutritional value (e.g. crisps, biscuits and sugary snacks in place of balanced meals); childhood obesity as a result of an unhealthy diet and lack of exercise has more recently been considered a form of neglect, given its serious long-term consequences.

# **Emotional neglect**

This involves a carer being unresponsive to a child's basic emotional needs, including failing to interact or provide affection, and failing to develop a child's self-esteem and sense of identity.

# **Educational neglect**

A child does not receive appropriate learning experiences; they may be unstimulated, denied appropriate experiences to enhance their development and / or experience a lack of interest in their achievements. This may also include carers failing to comply with state requirements regarding school attendance and failing to respond to any special educational needs.

## **Physical neglect**

A child has inadequate or inappropriate clothing (e.g. for the weather conditions), they experience poor levels of hygiene and cleanliness in their living conditions, or experience poor physical care despite the availability of sufficient resources. A child may also be abandoned or excluded from home.

# Neglect through lack of supervision and guidance

A child may be exposed to hazards and risks, parents or caregivers are inattentive to avoidable dangers, the child is left with inappropriate caregivers, and/ or experiences a lack of appropriate supervision and guidance. It can include failing to provide appropriate boundaries for young people about behaviours such as under-age sex and alcohol use.

We can all do our part to keep children safe from neglect by making ourselves and our colleagues aware of the signs of neglect.

# What to do if you think a child is suffering from neglect

If you have concerns about a child in Surrey who could be suffering from any of these types of neglect, call <u>Surrey's Children's Single</u> <u>Point of Access</u> on 0300 470 9100 or call 999 in an emergency.

#### **Important Safeguarding Information for Parents**

Along with most, if not all schools, St Charles has taken the opportunity to join the Operation Encompass scheme which will run jointly between local schools, Surrey Police and Surrey County Council.

Operation Encompass has been designed to provide early reporting on any domestic incidents that occur outside of school and might have an impact on a child in school.

Operation Encompass will ensure that a member of the school teaching staff, named a 'Key Adult' or "Deputy Key Adult", is informed the next morning that there has been a domestic incident or if a child has been reported as missing. These school colleagues will be those who already have safeguarding responsibilities and are fully aware of the sensitive and confidential issues regarding such information.

Through sharing this information with the Key Adult or Deputy Key Adult, the school can ensure that the child is supported in the most appropriate way during the school day.
