Nursery Applications for September 2022

All children will be entitled to 15 hours free pre-school education and some may even be entitled to 30 hours. School Attendance

This is a reminder that If you take your child(ren) out of school without authority, you may be liable to receive a penalty notice. Currently the amount payable under a penalty notice is £60.00 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days. Thereafter the amount increases to £120.00 if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that penalty notices are issued per parent/carer per child so a family of two parents and two children will receive 4 penalty notices. Please note that this does not apply to funerals, medical appointments etc.

Internet Safety Day with Sharon Girling OBE 26th January

The children had a really productive day with Sharon Girling OBE regarding how to stay safe online. Sharon was really impressed with the engagement of the children and their questions. We also received some additional staff training and I hope the 40 or so parents who attended the evening session found it useful too. Covid Update

Thank you for your continued patience and understanding with regards to our attempts to keep the disruption of COVID to a minimum. At all times we have tried to take the approach that being careful ensures that as many staff and children can remain in school, although we appreciate we cannot have restrictions in place for ever. Assuming numbers fall, we aim to return to having school based Masses with parents welcome as well as returning to larger gatherings.

On Thursday 27th January, 'Plan B' restrictions were lifted by the government and therefore, unless there is an outbreak in school, masks will no longer be needed in the playground. This of course remains a personal preference and many of you may choose to continue to wear a mask as will be the case in school. However, I would like to remind all parents that at no stage have masks been a requirement for Primary aged pupils, although for some of you, it has been your preference for your child to wear one. Please do continue to take Lateral flow tests and be vigilant/responsible in taking the correct action if any of your family presents with symptoms.
